### Did you know...?

#### There is no waiting line for refugees.

International law guarantees to people fleeing persecution the right to go to another country and seek asylum – that is why we have a refugee determination system.

International law recognizes that refugees often don't have the required documents to enter a foreign country.

The UN Convention relating to the Status of Refugees prohibits governments from penalizing refugees who enter or remain on their territory without the proper documents.

The cost of healthcare for refugees is a fraction of that of other Canadians.

Even before cuts to the Interim Federal Health program in 2012, the per capita cost of healthcare for refugees and refugee claimants was just 10% of that of other Canadians.
